"The Rest of the Story ..." -- Could we be it?

Dear Friend in the Messiah,

Many followers of Jesus are familiar with his beautiful and soothing words as he teaches, "Blessed are ..." in Matthew 5. "The meek." "Those who mourn." The peacemakers." "Those reviled for my sake." But what about "the rest of the Beatitude teaching story" time of Jesus that might not sit as well with our ears, but really is essential for harnessing our hearts, our minds, and our mouths for Christ?

CONSIDER:

Matthew 5:37: "Let your word be 'Yes, Yes' or 'No, No;' anything more than this comes from the evil one."

Matthew 5:37: (Concerning Retaliation) "You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.' But I say to you, do not resist an evildoer. But if anyone strikes you on the right cheek, turn the other also; and if anyone wants to sue you and take your coat, give your cloak as well; and if anyone forces you to go one mile, go also the second mile."

Matthew 5:43-48: "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of your Father in heaven ... For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? ... And if you greet only your brothers and sisters, what more are you doing than others? Do not even the Gentiles do the same? Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect."

This summer has been HOT ... but the words, the threats, the hatred, the violence even hotter. In our fear and justifiable anxiety to what we are seeing, what we are saying can add to the fires of hell burning among us. In Matthew 5 Jesus speaks specifically to the characteristics, values and behaviors that he expects and intends for citizens of His Kingdom. Now, perhaps more than ever in our lives, is the time to ask the Holy Spirit to harness our hearts, our minds and our mouths that they might give witness to a Way (The Way) of Christ that is our only hope and our only way for life beyond our own damnation and destruction (in word and in deed).

Will you join St. Patrick and billions who have gone before us in Christ present to harness us for His Kingdom? If so, let us pray: "Christ be with me, Christ within me, Christ behind me, Christ before me, Christ beside me, Christ to win me, Christ to comfort and restore me. Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ in quiet, Christ in danger, Christ in hearts of all that love me, Christ in mouth of friend and stranger." Amen. So be it. And may it begin with me. WORSHIP MINISTRY



"Reaching with the Heart of God for the Lives of Our Community"

This is the statement that is listed each week at the top of the AUMC worship folder. One of the ways that we reach out to the community is through the offering of worship services each week. On Sundays, we come together in corporate worship as a body of Christ to offer ourselves to our CREATOR.

In Romans 12, Paul talks about the Body of Christ being made up of many parts just as our physical bodies also are made of many parts. Each one is important and needed for the other parts to work. Each one has been given different gifts, and these gifts are needed for the Body as a whole.

In the area of Worship Ministry, there are several teams that make up "parts of this Body." Several of those teams are in need of people gifted in that area, so that we can better "*Reach out to the Community with the Heart of God.*" The teams are listed below, each with a contact person. If you have an interest or experience a Holy Spirit "nudge," reach out to that team leader. Your gifts and talents are needed to complete the AUMC BODY. Worship ministry is made up of MANY TEAMS, but here are a few:

Requires serving on a Sunday morning approximately 1 time every 4 to 6 weeks. Thursday night rehearsal is required for the Sunday you are scheduled. Training is provided; all you need is a love for God, a teachable spirit, and a love for music.

Computer Entry: Contact person: Jen Benson: <u>ktjm3@comcast.net</u> Requires computer input on a Thursday night during Praise Team Rehearsal approximately once every 5 weeks. Basic computer skills needed, we use a very easy worship computer program. Training provided.

Computer Operator: Contact person: Terrie Strockbine: <u>tstrockbine@comcast.net</u> This team operates the computer on a Sunday morning. When scheduled, you work all 3 Sunday morning services. Serve once every 2 months.

Choir Ministry

Once again, here we go into another fall season, and with that season comes the sounds of voices from the sanctuary on Monday nights. It's time for CHOIR REHEARSAL! Monday night September 12th at 7 PM will be our first rehearsal.

All are invited, and encouraged to attend. If you are new to the body, this group is a great way to get acquainted with others while not feeling out of sorts because you are the "new guy." You will find the ALDERSGATE CHOIR a very welcoming group. We LOVE new members! We have a common goal, to lift our voices in praise to the ONE who deserves it, and we have so much fun doing it! 
Join Us This Fall

Thank you!



In April, Deb Cochran revealed her passion to stop cancer, and invited the congregation to join the 2016 West Shore Relay for Life. At that time she was hoping Aldersgate church might have 10 to 20 people sign up as the Aldersgate team and walk the relay collecting donations for the American Cancer Society.

As the invitation was shared with the congregation, prayers were being sent up asking God's guidance and blessing for individuals to sign up and for those attempting to coordinate this ministry outreach. God was well ahead of us; over 90 individuals responded to our invitation and joined the Aldersgate Cancer Crushers. On the day of the Relay, a large number of the Aldersgate walkers arrived early in the morning to walk the ceremonial first lap as the Aldersgate team. In addition to these walkers, individuals from our Aldersgate family came to support the walkers by walking with them during this initial lap. I was amazed at the commitment of the walkers, 30 minutes around the lap! Many team members had a full day of activities planned and yet they made time for the 30 minute walk. The last of the walkers showed up at 10:30 pm, it was dark by that time, but the track was well lit. Well, it was well lit until some of the tracks lights mysteriously went out, but our walkers continued walking their lap with flash lights and light sticks in hand!

Praise God for each and every one of you who supported this ministry outreach. Many of you purchased the Aldersgate T-Shirts, others of you submitted names for the back of the T-Shirts with a donation going to the American Cancer Society. Over one hundred names of individuals who have or had battled cancer were placed on the back of these T-Shirts. Many of you lifted the ministry and the walkers in your prayers, thank you.

Thank you to the coordinators, Bonnie and Dennis Knoetgen, Karen Kammeier who checked and tripled checked the spelling of the names submitted, and the T-Shirt orders submitted. Deb Cochran, Bonnie, Dennis, Karen and Kara Eppley "manned" the Relay Table for a month of Sundays helping individuals sign up to walk, place names on T-Shirts or order T-Shirts, etc. At the time this article was written, over \$9,000.00 was collected and sent to the American Cancer Society on behalf of Aldersgate Church.

Most importantly church, we praise God for this opportunity to share the love of Christ with our community around us through this event!

Additionally, each month a wire transfer of **\$2,083.00** is sent to the Krichev Revival UMC Church in Belarus.

On behalf of the Stewardship & Finance Committee, I want to extend a sincere thank you. Aldersgate's church family consistently shares of their God given bounty with generous hearts.

Because of your giving we have been able to do several church maintenance projects, continued to generously support mission outreach, and have even put additional, over the budget, money on the mortgage.

It is important for you to know that money received is being distributed with consideration and responsible thinking. We as a committee respect the confidence entrusted to us.

We are approaching our annual September Take a Bite Out of the Debt offering. For several years we have been working hard to pay down this debt. Beside the budgeted payments, there are several additional ways money is applied to the debt. When you buy a Giant Food card, 5% goes to reduce the debt. If you work at Hershey Park, if you pay for use of the facility, if you buy Christmas Gift cards, proceeds go directly to paying off the debt. The interest earned on our checking account, designated building fund giving, Election Day food sale profits all go to pay down the debt. It all adds up!

With the approaching special September 25th offering, we anticipate seeing the debt balance drop below 1 million dollars!

It is indeed an exciting time for Aldersgate Church. I know you will want to be a part of this special blessing. It will be A God Moment! Prayerfully consider your offering. Together we can do this.

The repair work on the sidewalks as well as removal of two large trees at the Church Parsonage have been completed. All went very well and the

cost for both projects came to a cost of \$3,400. Additionally, at the Parsonage, we had an outside water faucet break and had water damage to the basement area. This is a homeowner insurance claim and the entire cost to remove damaged drywall, carpet and rebuild was \$5,335.19 less a \$1,000 deductible which leaves a remaining balance of \$4,335.19. Instead of restoring to original condition it was decided by leadership to make numerous upgrades. We are presently in the process of receiving bid proposals and will then make a decision to move forward.

The painting project went smoothly and is 100% complete. Carpet installation outside the FLC and in the hallways in the original section of our facility was completed by the end of July. This has been a rather long project but I am very happy with the services we have received. We would like to thank the congregation for your patience.

Moving forward, I will be in the process of receiving bids to have the kitchen area deep cleaned, carpet cleaning in the FLC & pre-school classrooms, and window cleaning throughout the building.

I would like to report that as of 7-8-16 my evening custodian handed in his letter of resignation and that has created a void until we are able to go through the process and find a replacement. During this period, I have been trying to utilize our per diem personnel to continue to provide a clean and safe facility.

THE ABUNDANCE IS ALREADY OURS.

LET'S NOT MISS IT, ALDERSGATE CHURCH!

Control often is an outgrowth of fear.

Fear most often is fueled by insecurities.

Faith communities with "no money" as well as those with "never enough money" major in "<u>insecurities and exchange</u> them for sin commissions."

A great guard against all the above – and a proven deliverance through the threat of all the above – lies in having and choosing an Attitude of Gratitude. May God use this report and reflection to grow us in that practice of giving God our thanks and praise!

Matthew 14:13-21 (see also Mark 6:30-44, Luke 9:10-17, John 6:1-14) Jesus feeding the five thousand with "nothing here but five loaves and two fish." (v. 17) Often thinking we don't have enough we fail to see and take seriously what we already have. It is from what we have, not what we don't, that we find what we need ... and then some!

Multiple lists of abundant blessing and truth to the above points could be assembled. Here is one: AUMC facility improvement projects over mostly the last five years.

- 1. Security System for Pre-School & Church (2009) \$8,000
- 2. New telephone system installed (2012) \$9,000
- 3. Purchased a new van. (c. 2011) \$18,000
- 4. HVAC Ductwork upgrade in Resource & Youth Room, and Youth Room Renovation (c. 2011) – \$7,000
- 5. Installed New Awnings @ 4 Entrances (2013) \$5,900
- 6. Replaced old storage shed. (2014) \$3,600
- 7. Replaced Lighting System Control in Sanctuary (2014) \$13,000
- 8. New & Expanded Playground/Equipment (2015) \$30,000
- 9. Installed new carpet in education/worship corridors (2014) \$15,700
- 10. Painted FLC and had chair rail installed. (2015) \$5,000
- 11. New Projector Project / Sanctuary (2015) \$10,000
- 12. New sound system installed in Sanctuary (2016) \$25,000
- 13. Purchased 3 risers for use in Sanctuary (2016) \$5,000
- 14. Sanctuary, Narthex, all hallways and Office painted (2016) \$33,500
- 15. Hallway carpeting in FLC section, completing lower level carpeting (2016) \$7,000

That's more than \$190,000 in special projects, and this does not include other beyond- maintenance actions such as \$10,000 for repair, fill and sealing of the parking lot for the first time in a long time a few years back.

All of these projects were accomplished without One Dollar (\$1) of funding from our yearly AUMC Ministry Spending Plan (OPERATION BUDGET). In fact, not all that long ago, if a project was included as a line item in the "operations budget," it routinely went unfunded and was "set aside" for another year due to lack of funding. Just a few short years ago, we barely met day-to-day operation needs let alone projects. Thanks to visionary leadership among our Trustees, our Stewardship & Finance Committee, and our Church Council at the time, God's outpouring of blessing was named; it was noted; and a unified and bold decision was made to use the giving bounty to address needed upgrades from the overflow of resources God provided! A movement toward a Capital Fund debt reduction campaign was even set aside as giving grew.

In fact, at the beginning of 2009, AUMC's savings and checking total (aside from an emergency fund of \$35,000) totaled barely \$9,000. As the Holy Spirit worked spiritual renewal, re-focus, inventory of blessings, confession of our fears, and release of our control, the financial issues dissipated as Christ in us was glorified and revealed. With every new ministry "expense" and every project undertaken, dollars were spent and

giving grew the ministry fund balance! <u>That's God's Economy</u>! It sure doesn't compute or work like human economies. In fact, over the last five years, the AUMC Building Loan

balance plummeted from nearly \$1.8 million to now, August 2016, just a tick above \$1.0 Million. We are on the verge (\$14,000) of the building debt dropping below \$1 million! – and in spite of these massive debt pay downs (\$800,000) Aldersgate's savings/checking balance grew, often rising to upwards of \$250,000 from \$9,000 back in 2009. <u>That's God's Economy</u>!

So, what is our continuing role in this? First, give thanks without ceasing – lest we complain with our mouths full and then fret and worry our way back into "scarcity" amidst God's great abundance. Secondly, fear not – lest we seek to re-take control to our own detriment and captivity. Thirdly, trust in God's faithfulness – lest we measure all things by our own securities and exchange commissions of sin.

Matthew 25:14-30 (see also Luke 19:12-27) Wanting more, thinking what we have is not enough, we squander opportunity presently ours, "just as I am, without one plea," in the words of the gospel song. In this well-known parable of the talents, as in Luke's of the pounds, the message is use it or lose it. It is in the use of what we have, not the amount, that we learn and practice, or practice and then learn still more, the abundance already ours.

Look what God has done and be assured of what God will continue to do! Give Thanks Without Ceasing! Fear Not! Trust in God's Faithfulness! (And while we're at these Disciple disciplines, why not smile for good measure?)
