Dear Friend in the Messiah,

We have various opportunities to Fall Forward for Faith Growth over the next few months. Here's just a few for you to consider, perhaps in new light!

<u>What's Up Wednesday</u> – Doing a Bible study to gain information isn't wrong at all, but that's not the ultimate purpose, either. Consider participating in a faith growth study through What's Up Wednesday this Fall, not because of what you can gain information-wise, but for the amazing ways God just might want to grow your awareness of his mystery, his power, his might, and his ways! We're never too old or too "learned" in the "facts" of faith to be stretched in the awe of a faith relationship with Jesus!

Bite Out of Debt sacrificial offering, September 25 – Surely in this month AUMC's long-standing building loan debt will drop below \$1 million after the rapid paydown that we've experienced of \$800,000 in the last 5 years. The "Bite Out of Debt" offering invites us to give a sacrificial gift to further plunge that debt and ultimately free up resources for practical ministry right here, right now. However, that's not the ultimate reason to give. By taking part in the Bite Out of Debt Sept. 25 offering, you are living the witness of the Church and of two or three (and more) doing greater things than we ever could do alone; you are exercising the "giving" image of your Maker that lies within you, and that is essential for the salvation stretching of your soul to make room for the renewing image of God; and you are giving yourself opportunity to learn the joy of sacrifice in an age that over -emphasizes self-satisfaction.

FALL-FEST 2016. Oct. 16! – A different twist for Fall-Fest this October: Council has endorsed having ONE combined Outdoor worship service, 11 a.m., on Sunday, Oct. 16 to kick-off a Fall-Fest day of celebration and hospitality to the community! We realize this messes with your customary worship schedules, but ask for your grace to participate in the one-combined worship service. The sounds of our praise to God will cascade through the neighborhood, and the inviting aromas of food and the sounds of fun will reach out as well. Plans are in the early, early stages, but possibly include a car corral, live music, food, entertainment and activities for children and youth, and an emergency-responder recognition/celebration during worship. Jodie Dodson has agreed to facilitate the event, but YOUR involvement is needed and valued! Please be thinking about ways to make this event one to remember, and be in touch with Jodie or the Office with your thoughts!

Choir Ministry

With the fall comes CHOIR SEASON! All are invited to attend! We love singing for God, and would love to have you there! September rehearsals are 1 hour in length, ending at 8PM.

This is when we begin preparation for the Christmas Cantata, "The Silence and the Sound" written by Heather Sorenson. We are excited to offer this cantata (musical program), which is Heather Sorenson's first cantata ever! She is a talented composer whose anthems we have used a few times in the AUMC choir. In addition to Sunday School, Children's Ministry offers programs at other times during the week: **Adventure Club** for K-3rd Graders meets 1st and 3rd Sundays from 2-4pm in the FLC, beginning on September 18th. Adventure Club resembles a mini-VBS with Bibles Story, games, crafts and snack.

Summit Seekers for 4th and 5th Graders is also held the 1st and 3rd Sundays from 2-4 in the Youth Room. This program is specifically designed for preteens; bridging the gap before youth. We host fun activities throughout the year including mission projects, laser tag, overnights and special game nights.

WUW4Kids: For all children Kindergarten - 5th Grade whether parents participate in a Bible Study or not. Join us at 6:30pm every Wednesday beginning September 14th. We know you have been in school all day so you will have time to run off that extra energy while we also take time to dive into some hands-on Bible lessons and get to know one another a little better.

Plugging In.. Share the Journey With Your Child

School, Sports, Band, Scouts...you name it, our kids are or can be involved in it and these activities often include Sunday mornings. How do we as parents let our children know the importance of Church when all these other activities are going on? One way can be to take an active role in your child's Christian development. Take a moment to prayerfully consider volunteering just a couple times a month. Here are just some opportunities that are currently available:

Small Group Leader: Children begin in their individual classrooms for intro to the lesson for the day, attend Large Group in the FLC and then return to Sunday School classroom for Small Group activity and discussion. Word by Word/Step by Step Curriculum is provided. All materials are prepared for you ahead of time.

Commitment: 9:30 Sunday School time, twice a month.

Large Group Leader: Present the Large Group lesson to Kindergarten - 3rd Graders. Commitment is each Sunday for just one month from 9:40-10am. Lesson and help is provided. No memorization needed. Feel free to ask your child what Large Group is all about.

WUW4Kids: Are you interested in lending a hand? I know every Wednesday is a HUGE commitment so I'm looking to rotate volunteers by the month or every other week. If you are interested...let's talk!

Substitutes: Can't commit to long term? Substitutes are needed for Sunday School, Adventure Club and Wednesday nights. If you are willing to be put on a list, just let me know!

CAN FAITH AND SCIENCE COEXIST?
